

## **MEDIA RULES AND REGULATIONS AT THE INTERNATIONAL MULTISPORT TOURNAMENT "GAMES OF THE FUTURE" IN 2024 IN KAZAN FOR MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES**

In order to hold the Games at a high international level, as well as to organize and create conditions for the effective work of the Media, each Media representative shall comply with the following rules of conduct and work at the Games venues.

### **RULES OF WORK IN MEDIA AREAS**

In Media working areas it is not allowed:

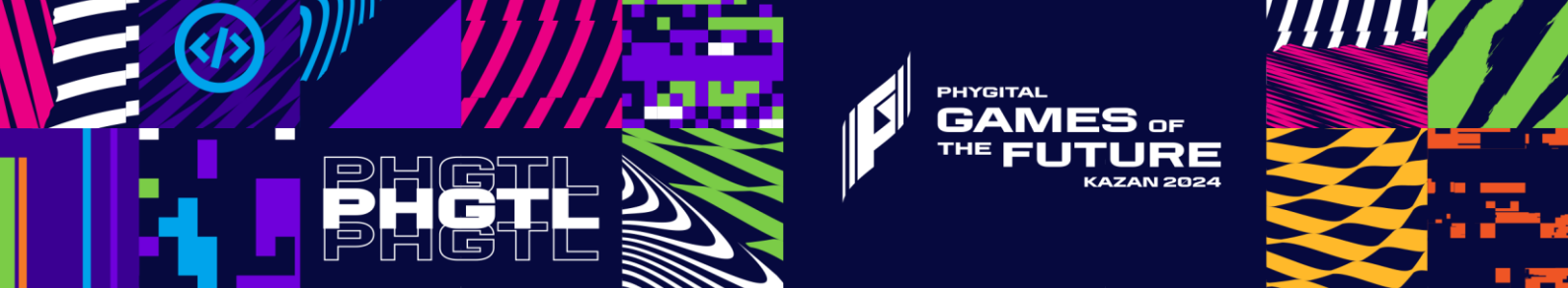
- to independently change the furniture arrangement and reorganize workplaces, reserve workplaces in any way;
- to leave personal belongings in lockers in press centres or storage rooms overnight;
- to shoot photos or videos of office premises and employees of the Organizing Committee without their consent;
- to express support for one or more performing athletes (teams) from Media workplaces.

### **PHOTOGRAPHERS GUIDELINES**

When working at the Games venues, photographers agree:

- to attend photographer's briefings in order to be informed about the rules of work;
- to work at the Games venues in a photographer bib (provided once for the entire period of the Games);
- to work at the photo positions in black clothes (total black);
- to work sitting at the photo positions equipped with benches/chairs;
- to take photos without using flash during competitions;
- not to record video with a photo camera, not to make audio recordings using any devices, including phones;
- not to use ladders and tripods (except monopods) at the photo positions;





- not to cause inconvenience to cameramen and other Media representatives while working in mixed zones, at press conferences and in other Media areas;
- to move through the photo positions only according to the instructions of volunteers and employees of the Department for Media Relations, announced at the briefing and in the work area.

## **CAMERAMEN/SOCIAL MEDIA GUIDELINES**

When working at the Games venues, cameramen agree:

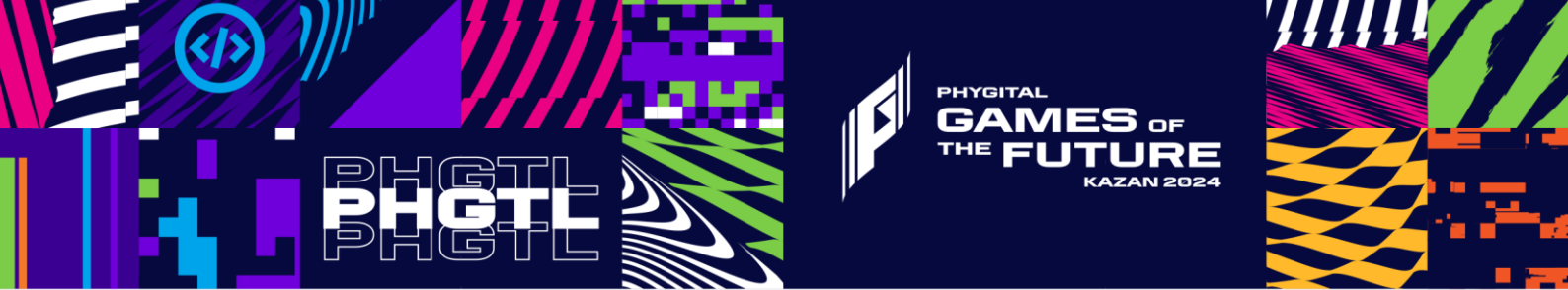
- to attend briefings of cameramen to be informed about the rules of work;
- to work at the Games venues in a TV bib (provided once for the entire period of the Games);
- not to use extra lighting during the competition;
- to work at the photo and TV positions in black clothes (total black);
- to move through the photo and TV positions only according to the instructions of volunteers and employees of the Department for Media Relations, announced at the briefing and in the work area.

## **INFLUENCERS GUIDELINES**

When working at the Games venues, influencers agree

- not to violate the legislation of the Russian Federation, regulations of the Games of the Future, moral and ethical standards, not to treat the organizers of the Games, staff working at the venue and visitors of the competitions with disrespect, not to damage the property, etc.;
- to present an accreditation card when visiting the venue, as well as in all venue areas that require accreditation;
- not to demonstrate their accreditation card in the photo, on social networks, video and streaming sites;
- to visit briefings with the employees of the Organizing Committee in order to be informed about the rules for shooting content at sports locations;
- not to cause inconvenience to cameramen and other Media representatives while working in the Media areas;





- to shoot at the photo and TV positions only in coordination with the Organizing Committee and with the necessary access areas mentioned on the accreditation card, as well as SAD (Supplementary Access Device);
- not to use extra lighting when recording during competitions on the field of play;
- 8) to discuss all the necessary list of services provided for the “Influencers” category with a representative of the Organizing Committee before the start of the Games during business correspondence.

### **ANY OF THE FOLLOWING POINTS MAY RESULT IN THE WITHDRAWAL OF ACCREDITATION:**

- aggressive, offensive behaviour or discrimination against the organizers, volunteers, guests and participants of the Games, being under the influence of alcohol or drugs at the Games venues;
- refusal to follow the rules and instructions of the organizers and security personnel, the Media rules and regulations;
- intentional obstruction of the work of other accredited Media representatives;
- intentional damaging, copying, complete or partial forgery of the accreditation card, as well as other abuse of accreditation, including, but not limited to attempted sale, transfer to third parties;
- intentional damaging, copying, complete or partial forgery of additional access devices (tickets, vests, etc.), as well as other misuse thereof, including, but not limited to attempted sale, transfer to third parties;
- zoning violation, as well as accessing athletes' locker rooms unaccompanied by the Press Officers and without coordination with the Department for Media Relations at the venue;
- requesting autographs, taking selfies with athletes or other officials of the Games in the Media areas.
